Aging Matters Annual Report 2022





Our goal is to continually provide new and innovative choices for our clients and caregivers. As recipients of another Retirement Research Foundation grant, we initiated the **Tailored Caregiver Assessment and Referral Program** (TCARE). TCARE focuses on preventing caregiver burnout, by providing individualized care plans for caregivers. We redesigned our **website**, providing easier access to programs and more ways to communicate with us. During 2022, we provided over 10,498 clients with direct services, while 6,732 clients waiting for services at the beginning of 2023.

2022 was a year of transitions. In-person workshops returned on a larger scale, and we said goodbye to our CEO of 15 years, Kristen Griffis. After an extensive search, Katina Mustipher was named our new leader. With 26 years at Elder Options, Katina has held a variety of executive and operational leadership roles at our organization. We are proud of our agency's offerings and we strive to continue serving more seniors, caregivers, and persons living with disabilities in our sixteen county service area.





Elder Options is an independent non-profit founded in 1977 designated by the State of Florida as the Area Agency on Aging/Aging and Disability Resource Center for Alachua, Bradford, Citrus, Columbia, Dixie, Gilchrist, Hamilton, Hernando, Lafayette, Lake, Levy, Marion, Putnam, Sumter, Suwannee, and Union counties.

We provide information and referral services, benefits counseling, screening and eligibility assistance, Healthy Aging workshops on diabetes, classes for improving and maintaining balance - such as Tai Chi, one-on-one help for depression, SHINE Medicare counseling, Caregiver Training, and Support, and administer state and federal pass-through funds via grants awarded to contracted service providers.
